


As communicated with you at the beginning of Level 4 restrictions, we are not asking parents to 'home-school' their children. We are not asking you to replicate the school environment with curriculum instruction at home or to reconfigure your home to have an area set up to be a classroom. Modern education is not what we experienced as kids. Whilst we will provide you with some resources that we use at school which you can also use at home, the best that you can do is to do things with them that will build important life skills and reassure them that everything will be ok in time. You are their parents and family members first, NOT their classroom teachers. Whatever happens, we will make sure your child has the tools they need to succeed in school when the time comes.

Lots of learning activities in the classroom already occur through our class weebly sites or through Google Classroom (your child will know which their class uses). Senior Area teachers will be 'posting' work through these sites for you and your child to engage with. Remember, these are suggestions of what you and your child could do. You can do as much or as little as you are able to - we encourage you to do things together that enhance cooperation and relationships between family members and do the things that you know will have the best outcomes given the day and the other things that are going on. Remember that the **process is often more important than the product** in learning situations!


