Principal's Comment Nga Korero o te Tumuaki

Kia ora Whānau, ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

We are now at the halfway mark for the term and many of you will agree it has certainly gone quickly so far. It's encouraging to see the days are gradually getting longer as we head into spring.

On Tuesday afternoon our junior team hosted a reading information afternoon for parents and whānau. They shared current reading strategies to show progressions as children move from a focus on decoding to comprehending text. Parents then had the opportunity to see these strategies in action as teachers worked with small groups of children. Many thanks to everyone involved and to our whānau who attended.





Last week we had groups representing Allenton at the Mid Canterbury Dance Champs on Monday and Tuesday evenings and the Hakatere Festival during the day on Friday, where our kapa haka and multicultural groups performed. This was the culmination of many hours of practice at lunchtimes and even on the weekends! They all had their time to shine on the stage at their respective events and did brilliantly. We are so proud of them. Some students were involved in groups at both ends of the week! Well done and many thanks to all students, staff and parents involved.







Yesterday many of our Year 5 and 6 students competed in the Mid Canterbury Schools Winter Tournament. It was great weather for sport and those who took part had a most excellent time! A huge thank you to all our parent and staff coaches / managers who have spent many weeks preparing the teams, as well as our supporters encouraging the teams from the sidelines. Our teams did very well and achieved results they can be proud of. Our Rugby team and one of our Netball teams qualified for the Canterbury-wide tournament, which is a massive achievement!





With the tournament on yesterday, the seniors who were still at school did an "Aquacise" class instead of the traditional swimming lessons. Feedback from the teachers who went was very positive!





Over the next couple of weeks, we will be asking parents, students and staff some questions to assist with future school direction over the next three years. - The greatest priorities for our school over the next three years


Children will do their questions in class, with the support of their teacher.



Please read below further information about next week's Book Week.

Book Fair:

23-24 August, 3:00-4:30

Students will have class time on Monday and Tuesday to see books that they may be interested in. On Wednesday and Thursday afternoon, the library will be opened up like a shop and parents and students may come and purchase new books from Scholastic. Eftpos and Cash Sales are available, please bring the correct cash if possible. In previous years, we have had some problems with overcrowding at the Book Fair, especially in the first half an hour after school finishes. Due to this we are asking that Junior students, their siblings and families come on Wednesday afternoon and all other students wait until Thursday afternoon. The most popular titles can be ordered at the Book Fair, and delivered to school later, a bit like online shopping. There is time set aside during the school day on Thursday for students who can shop by themselves to visit the Book Fair.

Invitation to Parents

From 2:30 on Monday to Thursday of Book Week, we are inviting parents to come to school and share their favourite children's book with their child/ren and their classmates. Please contact your child's teacher to organise a day and let us know your preference of whether to share to a whole class or smaller group. Dress Up for Book Week!

We love a good dress up day at Allenton School. On Thursday 24, children come to school as a book character or an author. They could also choose to dress in a costume to go with a Non-fiction book. We will have a parade of all students at 9:15 on the School Courts which parents are welcome to attend. If it is wet, we will make other arrangements for students to have an indoor parade for each other.

Reading Challenge

Students will come home with a Reading Challenge on Friday that they can start working on over the weekend and complete over Book Week. They complete the number of challenges that match their age, eg. 7 year olds do 7 challenges. Please sign them off for your children. Bring the sheet back to school each day so teachers can sign off their reading efforts at school too. Completed Reading Challenges need to be delivered to the labelled box in the school office by 9:00 on Friday 25 August.

Other Events

During the school day, there will be guest readers, special reading activities, prizes and quizzes. Students need to have a book ready to stop and read for 5 minutes when they hear "The Superman Theme" over the speakers. Keep an eye on Facebook and Seesaw for updates on all the fun!
