## Principal's Comment Nga Korero o te Tumuaki

Kia ora Whānau, ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

We are now at the mid point of Term 2; the last five weeks have certainly flown by! I trust the term is going well for your children in their learning and connections with other students. We have seen

a number of absences due to sickness and children who are leaving during the day, again due to sickness. Many thanks for your support with this.

As I write this newsletter, schools throughout the country are in somewhat of a holding pattern as we wait for the outcome of collective agreement negotiations between the Ministry of Education (MOE) and the teachers' union - NZ Educational Institute (NZEI). These have been ongoing for many months now. While the two parties have recommenced negotiations this week, if no satisfactory offer can be presented by the MOE, then teachers will be involved in strike action next Wednesday, 31 May. This means that school will be closed for instruction and children will remain at home on this day. Schools will be informed of the outcome of the negotiations hopefully by Monday and we will put updates out through Facebook and Skool Loop as soon as we know. If strike action does go ahead the Pasifika family fono that was planned for next Wednesday will be postponed to a later date to be advised.

Our Middle Area held their cross country at school last Tuesday and it was wonderful to see high levels of parents and whānau support on the sidelines. Congratulations to all students who took part in this event and for the effort they put into completing their race.





We entered three teams in the Mid Canterbury Schools' Rippa Tournament yesterday, held at the Showgrounds. Well done to all teams who had an enjoyable day out and achieved some good results. Jackson and Lachie have written a report of the day below.


