Principal's Comment Nga Korero o te Tumuaki

Kia ora Whānau, ka nui te mihi ki a koutou - greetings to you all.

Over the past couple of weeks we have welcomed two new staff members to the Allenton School. Raewyn Geddes is our newest member of the teacher aide team and Kathryn Barr has been

appointed to the front office position. It's great to have them both on board and trust that their time at Allenton is an enjoyable one.

Another one of our teacher aides has been shining brightly at a national sporting level. Lydia Wilson has been selected as a netball umpire to officiate at the NZ Under 18 netball champs for the second year in a row. This event will be held in Hamilton during the term break. Lydia is also a member of the Netball Mainland High Performance Umpire squad. We wish her well for her umpiring duties over the term break.



Last week our school choir performed at the Mid Canterbury Schools' Music Festival. I was fortunate enough to be in the audience on the night they performed and was treated to some

amazing singing from our choir, alongside other schools. Of and Maya who were the soloists as part of our school items did exceptionally well as did Peni who was part of the Representative Choir. Special thanks to Mrs Sarah Yeoman who prepared the choir superbly and to everyone who represented Allenton School so well.

This Wednesday we had three girls competing in the Canterbury Zone Cross Country in Christchurch. Year 5 students Aubrey, Sylvie and Year 6 student Sarah qualified through the Mid Canterbury event. Congratulations to all three girls and especially to Aubrey for coming second in her event - a remarkable achievement!

A key focus in education for some time has been on student attendance, due to overall low levels across the country. We will soon again be making contact with parents of students who have had attendance concerns across this term. A day missed here or there doesn't seem a lot, but over time this certainly adds up - every day at school counts. The Ministry of Education defines regular attendance as 90% or more. The table below provides an idea of the effects of irregular attendance on a child's learning.

Attendance percentage	Which means your child misses	Which equals	or	At the end of Year 10
90%	1 day a fortnight	5 days a term	20 days / 4 school weeks per year	200 days or a full school year missed
80%	1 day a week	10 days a term	40 days / 8 school weeks per year	400 days or a 2 full school years missed
60%	2 days a week	20 days a term	80 days / 16 school weeks a year	4 full school years missed
40%	3 days a week	30 days a term	120 days / 24 school weeks a year	8 full school years missed

This is the time of the year when we think about Matariki, which marks the beginning of the new year in the Māori lunar calendar. 2022 was the first year when Matariki was designated as an official public holiday and this year is celebrated on Friday 14 July, which falls during the term break.

Next Friday, 30 June at 2pm we will be holding a special ceremony for Charlotte McLeod, an Allenton student who passed away two years ago. Charlotte would have been a Year 6 student this year. A memorial bench will be unveiled at the ceremony, which, due to unpredictable weather conditions at this time of year, will take place in the school hall. The bench will later be placed on the far side of the field. All staff and students will join Charlotte's family for the ceremony. Parents and other members of our school whānau should contact the school office by Wednesday 28 June if they wish to attend.






